How do i transfer from my old computer

With the iTunes program you can download music and store it on your computer. You can share your music on up to five computers on a home network with home sharing, and transfer songs without having to burn a CD or save to an external device. If you want to transfer your music to another computer, you can easily copy and transfer your songs and playlists. The first step is to download and install the latest version of iTunes. Then make sure your new computer is authorized to play music downloaded from iTunes. Announcement You can use an external hard drive or your iPod to transfer your music to your new computer. To use iPod as an external hard drive, first connect to your computer and select iPod from the list of iTunes sources. Enable for disk usage by clicking the check box and ok. Create a new folder so you can find your music easily. Drag the songs you want to copy to the new folder and save them to your iPod or external device. You can also transfer your playlists by exporting your music library. Open iTunes on your new computer and select Import. You may need to free up space on your iPod if you have a lot of music stored on your computer. You can also transfer iTunes with a recordable CD or DVD. Click burn in iTune preferences and choose the data CD format. Create a new playlist with the songs you want to transfer and click Burn Disc. You can override iTunes authorization on your old computer once you've made all transfers. By Angie Gambone When you buy a new computer, you want to move most of your data from your old computer to your new computer. Among that data are the music and videos you have in iTunes. You can transfer your iTunes library from your old computer to the new machine. This saves you the hassle of re-importing all your songs or downloading them again from a third party. Transferring your iTunes library is simple, and can be done on a Mac or PC. Open iTunes on your old computer. Click the File drop-down menu, select Library, and choose Arrange Library. Click Consolidate Library and click OK. This will copy all your music to an iTunes folder on your hard drive. Close iTunes. The files will be copied to the iTunes folder on your hard drive. Move the iTunes folder to an external storage device. It can be an external hard drive, a mass storage device such as a USB flash drive, a CD or DVD, or even an iPod if you have enough space. Move the iTunes folder by clicking it and dragging it to the icon that represents your external storage device. Go to your new computer's iTunes folder. Connect the external storage device to the new computer. Move the new folder from the storage device to the same location as it was on your old computer. Replace the old folder with the new folder. Open iTunes on your new computer. iTunes will automatically import all your music into your library. All settings the old computer, including playlists and song ratings, will be transferred. By Greyson Ferguson Super 8mm is a film format used in older movie cameras. The format provides a slightly higher resolution than the standard of 8 mm, but not as large as 16 mm. If you have reels of old super 8mm film cans sitting around your home and want to import the content into your computer, it is possible to transfer the movie to a digital format by using a local movie transfer company. Stores like Walgreens and Rite Aid (and other local pharmacies) offer movie-to-CD transfers that are much cheaper than buying your own movie projector and video camera. Take your super 8mm film strip to a local photo processing company. These locations are often able to transfer footage to a CD or DVD, although the movie should often be sent to a larger installation. Therefore, the finished product takes a few days to return. Pick up the transferred CD/DVD when you arrive. (You will be given a return date once you leave the film super 8mm.) Insert the CD/DVD into your computer's disc drive. Close all autoplay windows that appear on the screen. Click Start, (My) Computer, and double-click the CD or DVD icon. A window will appear with all video files from the movie transfer. Click and drag the video files to your computer. Once complete, you can eject the CD/DVD from your computer. Computer.
